What We Do...

Heartline & Heart House

The Heartline program manager works with people in the community (outside our shelter)

who have needs with rent, utilities, medicine, food, paper products, diapers, formula, clothing and furniture. GED and C.N.A. classes are held in the Heartline Community room and taught by ICC.

Clients make an appointment with the program manager to go over their income and expenses. Then they are assisted with budgeting and determining what services are available. Clients are referred to other agencies for services that Heartline does not provide.

Heartline schedules and facilitates community classes open to the public that assist with financial education. At these classes, clients receive free paper & hygiene products. Heartline coordinates service events such as Operation Backpack, Thanksgiving from the Heart and Tree of Hearts.

- Physical
- Mental
- Emotional
- Spiritual

Shelter residents and their children work closely with staff to assure individualized programs are established to best suit immediate and long-term needs. Program directives change throughout clients progression through the program.

Staff will continually assess residents on-going needs to maintain an individualized plan. This plan will prepare them to make pertinent steps in gaining self-reliance. They learn the tools to achieve self-confidence, deeper knowledge of self-worth, and the ability to successfully live independently.
